### PLACE IN ECHELON OF COMMAND

Marine Attack Squadron 251 was attached to Marine Aircraft Group Thirteen, Aircraft, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, Commanded by Colonel Ernest R. WEST 04731/9907 USMC, from 1 January through 3 January 1952 and from 4 January through 30 June 1952 was a unit of Marine Aircraft Group Fifteen, Commanded by Colonel Edward B. CARNEY 04620/9907 USMC.

This Squadron is located at Marine Corps Air Station, El Toro (Santa Ana), California

EVENTS OF HISTORICAL INPORTANCE

3 January 1952 VMA-251 was reassigned to MAG-15, from MAG-13

4 January 1952
Lieutenant Colonel Joe L. Warren 09309/7302 USMC was relieved of Command of VMA-251 by Lieutenant Colonel Arthur M. Moran 08610/7302 USMC.

Major F. G. Phillips 016482/7333 USMCR assumed duties as executive officer.

20 February 1952 to 28 February 1952
Personnel, aircraft, and equipment departed for Camp Pendleton on 20 February to participate in LEX BAKER I. The squadron returned on 28 February 1952.

6 April 1952 to 18 April 1952
On 6 April 1952 the squadron deployed to NAAS, El Centro via air lift.
A rear echelon of one officer and twenty five enlisted men were left behind. The mission of the squadron was to accomplish ordnance training.

On 10 April 1952 at 0728, Second Lieutenant D. R. ANNAND took off in AL-17 (81151) from NAAS, El Centro, as a member of a five (5) plane strafing flight. At approximately 0729, Lieutenant Annand made a forced landing approximately three fourths (3/4) of a mile southwest of service runway 21, NAAS, El Centro, California. The accident occurred immediately after take-off when the aircraft crash landed as a result of engine failure.

The aircraft suffered strike damage and the pilot was seriously injured. He has not recovered to date. (See Appendix 4) On 18 April 1952 the squadron deployed from MAAS, El Centro to MCAS, El Toro.

At 1208, 13 May 1952 Secont Lieutenant Joe K. Jensen took off from MCAS, El Toro as a member of a four (4) plane Ground Controlled Intercept and Camera Gunnery flight. At approximately 1220, the flight intercepted a four (4) plane B-29 formation which was flying at 15,000 feet. At the request of the B-29's, the fighters initiated single plane head-on runs.

After the other three (3) planes had completed their runs, Lt. Jensen collided with the left wing of one of the B-29's. Both aircraft, the F4U-4 and the B-29 sustained strike damage and spun violently into the sea. Lt. Jensen lost his life as did seven (7) members of the
