SUMMARY OF MONTHLY OF ERATIONS

During the month of November 1953, the Commanding Officer of Marine Attack Squadron 251 was Lieutenant Colonel Rufus D. SAMS, Jr., 07287/7331 U. S. Marine Corps. During this period the squadron was located at K-6 Air Base, Fyongtaek, Korea.

The month of November brought the squadron its first encounter with cold weather and the operational difficulties that accompany low temperatures. New insulation had previously been applied to the squadron's only nose hangar and four (4) Herman-Nelson heaters installed to blow hot air into the enclosure. These preparations have already paid dividends and in the future months they should prove adquate in the lower temperatures expected for this area.

During November a rather large number of the more experienced squadron officers were transferred out of the squadron. Their ranks were filled by a detachment of pilots from WA-332 plus replacements from the United States. The Operations Department began checking out the new pilots on the night patrol and night attack functions of the squadron so that they might help maintain the combat-readiness of WA-251.

On 30 November 1953, personnel assigned to Marine Attack Squadron 251 and the authorized T/O were as follows:

During the month of November 1953, Marine Attack Squadron 251 flew 547 Effective Sorties and there were 27 Air Aborts. for a total of 901.7 Operational Hours. Included in these figures are 92 Night Fatrol Sorties totaling 258.8 hours.

The daily average aircraft avialability was seventeen (17) with thirteen (13) AD-3, one (1) AD-3N, four (4) AD-4 and six (6) AD-4B type aircraft assigned.

To aid in quick starting and warm-up, a thin winter grade oil (1065) was substituted for the regular grade (1100).

The nose cowl flaps on the model AD-4 and AD-4B aircraft were connected to help keep engines warm on the night patrols.

Because no webbing is available in this area, the wing covers previously constructed in the parachute loft could not be completed and used to combat the hazard of frost on the wings of squadron aircraft. As an interim measure the wings of all aircraft are now folded every night and a coating of "Kilfrost" applied to the surfaces.

MATERIAL MONTHLY SUMMARY

As of 30 November 1953, one officer and six (6) men were assigned to the Material section.

The latter part of November overcoats, maps, pile lined, thermo boots and five (5) buckle over shoes were received and issued to the men.

Winter flight jackets and trousers were received and issued to the pilots; hoods and winter flying gloves: will be issued in the near future. All pilots have immersion suits with the exception of two (2) who require extra large sizes; these suits are on order.

During the Month of November 1953, there were 232 stub requisitions submitted; 149 priority "C" of which 109 were received; 59 priority "A" with 34 received and 24 ACOG's with 21 received.
