SUMMARY OF MONTHLY OPERATIONS

During the month of October 1953, Marine Attack Squadron 251, was located at K-6 Air Base, Pyongtaek, Korea. The Commanding Officer from 1 October through 15 October 1953 was Lieutenant Colonel Harold A. HARWOOD 08585/7331 U. S. Marine Corps. On 16 October 1953, Colonel HARWOOD was relieved by Lieutenant Colonel Rufus D. SAMS, Jr., 07287/7331 U. S. Marine Corps. Colonel HARWOOD has been assigned to S-4, Marine Aircraft Group 12. Colonel SAMS joined this squadron from Marine Airbase Squadron 12 where he was assigned as Commanding Officer. Colonel SAMS is serving his second tour of duty in Korea and has a total of 42 Korean Combat Missions. This Squadron is a unit of Marine Aircraft Group 12.

On 24 October 1953 Marine Attack Squadron 251 commenced Night Close Air Support Training, utilizing searchlights to illuminate and also pinpoint targets. The searchlights have been set up in the SUWON Bombing Range and are operated by a unit of the 1st Marine Division.

A Yellow alert was sounded at 1119 on 31 October 1953. All aircraft assigned to this squadron were dispersed in accordance with Marine Aircraft Group Secret General Order Number 75 of 17 August 1953. The alert was secured at 1145 and a critique was held at the Group Briefing Room in order that the discrepancies noted in the aircraft dispersal could be corrected.

During the month of October 1953, Marine Attack Squadron 251 flew a total of 495 Operational Sorties for a total of 781.7 Operational Hours. 80 Night Patrol sorties were flown for a total of 208.1 Night Patrol Hours. 91 Ground Controlled Approaches were made by pilots of this squadron during the month of October 1953.

The average aircraft availability for the month of October 1953 was 15. This squadron has 14 AD-3, four (4) AD-4, and six (6) AD-4B aircraft, for a total of 24 AD type aircraft assigned.
